J. W. Burt  
On July 14th, 1928, Erin Township lost by death, one of the sons of our pioneers in the person of John Wilson Burt. The late Mr. Burt was the second son of the late John W. Burt and grandson of George Burt, who settled in Erin Township, on lot 17, sixth concession, ninety-two years ago.  
Decaned was born in 1855 in the same house in which he died 73 years later. In 1878 he married Janet McKinnon, second daughter of the late Neil McKinnon who, with four sons and three daughters and sixteen grandchildren survive. They are Laurence; of Georgetown; Mrs. David Boveisen and Mrs. Peter Cole of Burlington; Mrs. D. J. Binclair of Chatham; and Clifford of Erin Township.

## Peel County Farmer Takes His Own Life

Supposed to have been suffering from depression following an attack of the flu since the late spring, Charles Fairdale, Chatham, formerly of the fifth line east, Chingonouy, hanged himself last Saturday morning by placing a noose around his neck and jumping from a beam in the barn. He left the house after 8 a.m., and when he did not appear again at 9 o'clock, his two sons, Gordon and Clarence, went out to look for him, finding him dead. Mr. R. H. Will be an inquest. Mr. Fairdale was born near Thicketton, the son of John Fairdale, spent his early married life on the west side of Peel, went to the east side five years ago and had just moved to a large farm in the Chatham district. He is survived by his widow and two sons, two sisters and two brothers.

Ottawa, Ontario.—By the end of the season 15 flying clubs will have been established throughout Canada, according to advice from the air board. A total of \$17,500 is being spent by the board this year in the promotion of these clubs for civilian flying. Clubs have already been established at Montreal, Toronto, Ottawa, Hamilton, Halifax, Saskatoon, Regina, Moose Jaw, Edmonton, Victoria, and London. One at Halifax and another at London are about to enter the list.

Transportation of small but valuable packages by air from Canadian Pacific lines at Rimouski to Montreal and Toronto, is being saved about 24 hours in time by becoming increasingly popular. At Montreal, Toronto, London and Chatham, Guelph had its turn with a parcel of Irish linen going to a department store there and the shipment being welcomed by Mayor Robson and other prominent citizens of the town. These parcels are handled by the Canadian Pacific Express Company.

A tablet in memory of men of the Seventh Royal Fusiliers who served with the Quebec garrison during the siege of 1776 is being unveiled at the site of the old Chateau St. Louis which was the military headquarters during the siege.

Inspection of the "Duchess of Bedford," new 20,000-ton Canadian Pacific liner, which recently made her maiden trip to Montreal, has disclosed the extreme suitability of the "Duchess" for tropical climates. Ventilated under the hull, Louvre system of individually controlled outlets, cool air is forced under airtight pressure to every part of the vessel. Broad deck and an open-air swimming pool add to the luxurious appearance of the ship and it has now been decided that the "Duchess of Athol" shall be used on the South America-South Africa cruise next year.
