Following the evidence obtained in Juvenile Court at Georgetown last week two dealers who were reported as selling cigarettes to minors, were charged with the offence by Chief Marshall. The accused came before Georgelown Magistrate Moore on the charge and both pleaded guilty to the sale from their respective stores to minors, but not by themselves. Others had made the sales, but both the dealers realized that they were responsible for all sales being made in their premises. They were fined \$5.00 and coats on each charge. The magistrate pointed out that the Minors' Protection Act renders it unlawful to sell cigarettes to any child under eighteen years of age. This applies also to the sale of tobacco and cigars. If children are sent to stores for tobacco, cigars or cigarettes by their parents a written order must be sent with them on every cocasion they are sent. Purthermore the magistrate stated, no tobacco, cigars nor cigarettes may legally be sold by any person on Sunday. Dealers violating the law in respect to these matters are liable to penalties up to \$50.00 for the first offence.
