## OPEN HEARON FIXED TO TAKE MURKIN

The Ontario Department of Game and Fisheries had altered its decision regarding the taking of muskrats and has now declared an open season—March 15th to April 21—for all parts of the Province.  
Representatives made before the Pelt and Game Committee at the last session of the Legislature were such that the department approved of an open season for the part of Ontario lying north of the French and Mattawa Rivers but banned rat trapping for 1929. In the remainder of the Province, since that time, however, Donald McDonald, Deputy Minister of the department, has interviewed, through several of his District Game Wardens, at least 1,000 trappers all of whom are emphatic that rats are again plentiful and are practically unanimous in an appeal for an open season.  
"All the department is interested in," stated Mr. McDonald, "is to see that there is sufficient protection for the animals, and we are quite willing to open the season in view of the favorable reports we have had."

That instead of disinterested, restless boys and girls, contented happy ones will eagerly curl themselves up in a comfortable chair with a book.

With many children it is a natural taste, but it is one that can be formed by almost any child with a little unnoted supervision. I say unnoted advisedly, don't force a child to read. Don't have the books too plentiful, no child wants to be talked down to in a book more than in real life.

Then there are countless tales of adventure, discovery, invention and achievement. Never have there been such wonderful juvenile books as there are now.
