Concentrates in the Nation for Dairy Cows

The individual qualifications of the cows are reported to consider when feeding concentrates to dairy cows. The feeding of expensive concentrates can be largely avoided if the farmer has a few cows in the herd, often these are the best milk producers at the farm. High production cannot be obtained without the use of considerable concentrates, but profits are not incompatible with such an expense and it is a mistake to believe that high records are always achieved with a few pounds of concentrate.

By consulting the report of the Experimental Station of St. Anne de la Pocatiere for the year 1927, it is seen that the heavy milkers caused more expense, but ultimately yielded more profit. For the benefit of the reader the following table has been compiled from the above-mentioned report:

The column "Feed cost per cow" represents the value of the feed used. Butter was valued at 30 cents per pound and the cream milk at 20 cents per hundredweight. The value of the calf was not included in the income. A glance at the above table will show that the profit over feed of the first lot was more than double the profit from the last one. In other words, it is more profitable to feed one good cow than two of average quality, and the use of concentrates is profitable in the first instance than in the second. The "first cost per cow" column reveals that the feed cost increases with the production. There is nothing surprising in this, for we expect that a milk producer will get more milk from his cow after all, but little that the feed cost was greater if the cow returned more profit.

In any case, the nineteen cows whose average production is recorded here were fed according to their individual qualifications, and each one yielded a profit. It is easily surmised that the feeding practice of first lot applied to the second and vice versa might have caused a deficit instead of a profit.
