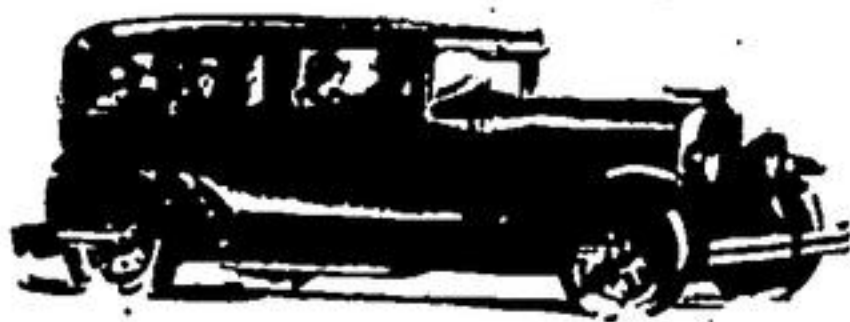

HOLSTEIN BREEDERS

THE Halton Holstein Breeders' Association held the second annual banquet recently in the Community Hall, where, when one hundred and forty sat down to a bountiful spread and tastefully decorated tables, the work of members of the Women's Institute. The tables were done in a color scheme of blue and gold, with blue and gold crepe paper, blue candles and golden daffodils. Walter Dennis, the president of the Association, was a very capable master of ceremonies. Toasts to the King and to the country were responded to by the singing of the national anthem and the Maple Leaf, with Miss Jessie Dearing presiding at the piano. In his short introductory address Mr. Dennis spoke of the possibility of the local association securing a field man, whose duties would include the advertising of stock, handling surplus cattle and otherwise assisting the members. The district representative of the agricultural department, A. P. MacVannan, was the first speaker introduced, and he assured the association that it had the backing of the department. He touched on the advisability of the added activity of promoting the health of the herd, as he claimed that there was a direct relationship between cattle and people, notably in the case of tuberculosis. He said he would like to suggest that Halton fall in line with the rest in securing accredited herds. Mr. Leslie, warden of Halton county, was the next one called upon to respond in replying, congratulating the members of the association on their forward-looking attitude towards two large cities, which provided an easily accessible market. Added to this he pointed out the advantages in good pasture and splendid roads. He mentioned the fact that only five per cent. of cattle were of the pure bred class, so that there was no danger of there being an oversupply of the best cattle. Mr. Leslie claimed that milk buyers should pay prices in accordance to milk test, and he also appealed to the local association to hasten its cooperation with the Milk Producers' Association. The president of Peel County association, Mr. C. DeLong, brought greetings from his county, and extended an invitation from the Eaton farm, York county, to join with Peel County in a monster picnic at the farm during the coming summer.

DOMINION INCOME TAX ACT

Once again, Hon. W. D. Euler, Minister of National Revenue, is using newspaper advertising to assist taxpayers in complying with the requirements of the Dominion Income Tax Act.

In this issue an advertisement appears reminding the public of the law which stipulates that certain information must be in the office of the Income Tax Inspectors by March 31st next. This information is required from employees, corporations, trustees or persons acting in a fiduciary capacity. It applies to year ending December 31st, 1928.

For instance, employers have to file a return giving the amounts paid each person in salaries, bonuses, commissions, and fees where the amount was \$1,000 or more, or where the salary or wages was at a rate of \$1,000 or more. Corporations have to file the names of those who were paid dividends, whether in cash or stock, and the amount of each. Persons acting in a fiduciary capacity, such as executors, administrators, receivers, trustees are required to file details of the trust with the names of and amounts paid to beneficiaries.

Persons mentioned in the act having to produce this information are asked to secure the proper forms from the nearest Income Tax Office, fill in their forms according to instructions, and mail them to the Income Tax Inspectors before March 31st. These forms are known as T3 for persons acting in a fiduciary capacity, T4 for employees and T5 for corporations. Each form contains complete instructions about what the law requires. These information forms only, and no cheques are sent with them.

Officials of the Department fully appreciate the trouble required in making out these forms, but are doing everything in their power to facilitate matters by reminding the public in plenty of time respecting the demands of the law.

The total collections under the Income Tax Act for last year are some \$20,000,000. It is estimated that for the year before, in spite of a ten per cent reduction in the tax, Mr. Euler attributes this increased collection to three things:

1. More efficient methods of collection.
2. The increased prosperity of the country.
3. Advertising.

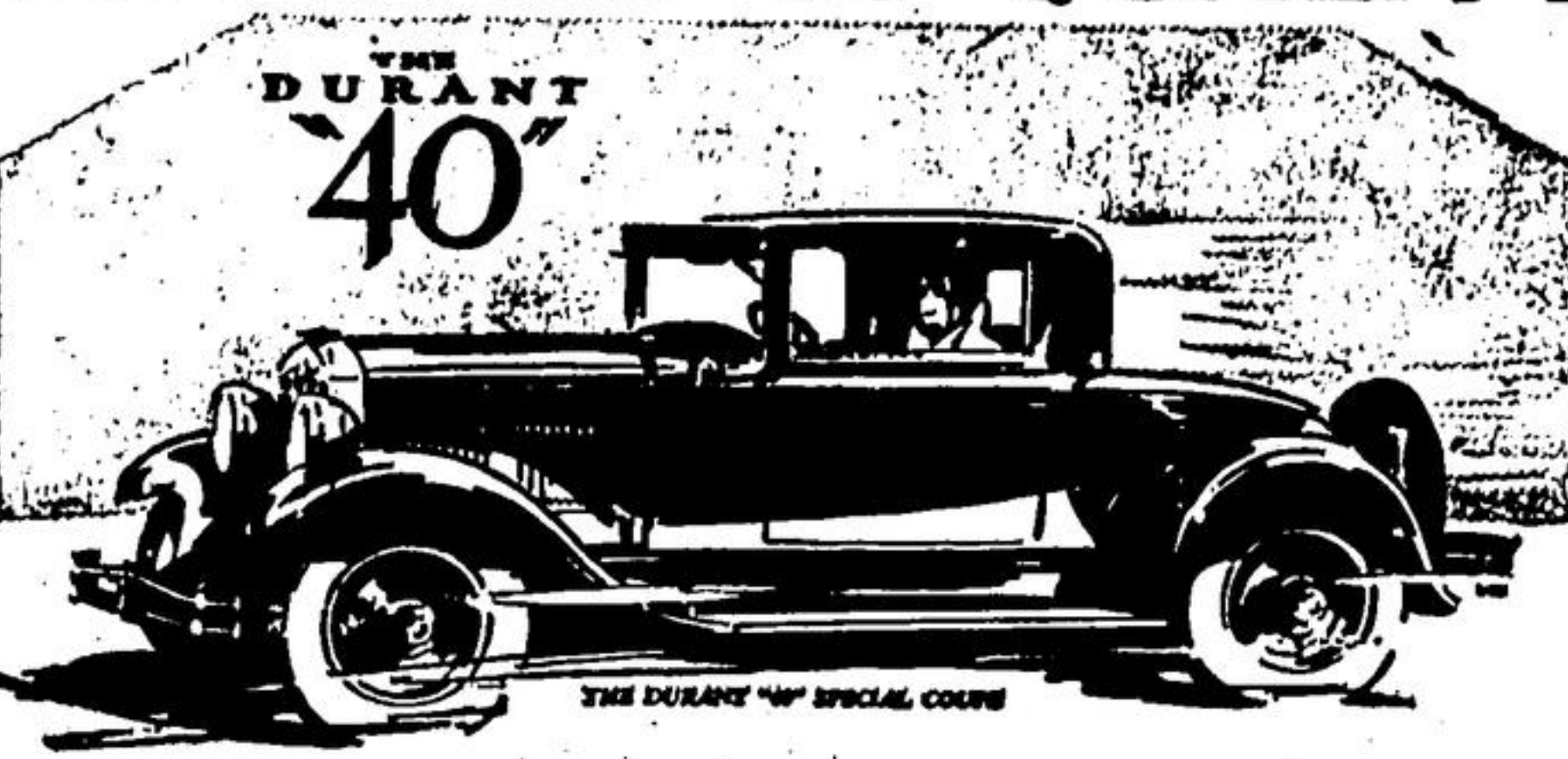

Trustees Employers Corporations

Do not incur the penalties which the law imposes for delay.

What is Required of Trustees

All trustees, executors, administrators, assignees, receivers or persons acting in a fiduciary capacity are required to make a detailed return of the income of the estate or trust which they represent.

This return should be made on Form T-3.

What is Required of Employers

Each employer in Canada must make a return giving particulars of salaries, wages, commissions, fees, bonuses and other remuneration of all direct

What is Required of Trustees

What is Required of Corporations

Every corporation in Canada is required to file a return of its dividends or shareholders' bonuses paid or credited during the calendar year 1928.

This return should be made on Form T-5.

Get Your Forms at Once!

Blank forms may be obtained by writing your nearest Inspector of Dominion Income Tax, or Postmaster, or the Income Tax Division, Department of National Revenue, Ottawa. The addresses of inspectors are given herewith. Full instructions appear on each form.

Do not delay because of the absence of officials who generally sign such reports. Any responsible member of a firm or corporation, or any person acting as agent for the trustee, may sign these returns and so avoid the penalty.

March 31 is the last day for making information reports required under the Income War Tax Act.

The Income Tax Division respectfully asks for the fullest cooperation of taxpayers required by law to make these returns.
