GOOD THINGS TO EAT
10 MINUTE HOT DRINKS
A TRY OF SUMMER DRINKS
Take your choice of the recipes below for today's thirst quencher, but try the others tomorrow and the day after. The fruit juices are filled with minerals, salts and vitamins. The sugar is a quick energy food that will put you in shape for another set of courts another nine-holes on the course, or even another round of bridge.

Pineapple Punch
1 quart water
2 cups sugar
2 cups chopped pineapple
1 cup orange juice
1/2 cup lemon juice
Boil water, sugar and pineapple 10 minutes. Add fruit juices, cool, strain and dilute with cold water if necessary. Filter through a fine sieve. Pineapple may be used.

Mint Julep
2 cups sugar
1 quart water
12 sprigs fresh mint
1/2 cup orange juice
1/2 cup lemon juice
1 pint grape juice
Boil sugar with 1 quart water 10 minutes. Chop mint and pour over it 1/4 cup boiling water, let stand 1 minute and add 1/4 cup orange juice. Add fruit juices and chill. Pour into punch bowl, add grape juice, dilute with cold water. Serve with mint leaves in each glass.

Cherry Delight
1/2 cup lemon juice
1 tablespoon grated lemon rind
Or. or 1/4 grape
1 cup orange juice
1 quart water
1/2 cup sugar
Cook sugar and water for 5 minutes; cool, and add the other ingredients.

AVOCADE SAUCE
Use the salad heavily in August and September. Fruits and vegetables of all kinds are plentiful and inexpensive. Salads are usually light and easy to digest. They may be made quickly and easily. What more could you want? Try the following:
Fruit Salad in Orange Cups
3 oranges
2 slices pineapple
1 cup orange juice
One-third cup nut meats
Two-thirds cup white grapes
Cut oranges in two; remove pulp carefully then pull out all membranes, leaving the pieces in one piece. Wash, drain and dry. Put in small pieces; skin and seed the grapes and mix with orange pulp. Fill orange cups cover with cream mayonnaise and garnish with grapes and nuts. Serve on ice.
ASPARAGUS SALAD
Cook the asparagus in salted water. The dressing consists of one-half teaspoon salt, a quarter teaspoon pepper, a half teaspoon sugar, a quarter teaspoon onion juice, one tablespoon vinegar and five tablespoons of olive oil. Mix and beat until thick and white. Keep the asparagus in the refrigerator until ready to serve. Then arrange the stalks on salad plates and serve the dressing in a sauceboat.
LIMA BEANS AND PARSNIPS
Lima beans are popular in many countries. The parsnips are valued by millions. It is actually a foreigner to some. Both vegetables should be used frequently. A little touch of sugar will make them not so sweet, but merely sufficient to accentuate the flavor—will always be found desirable.

SAVOIRY LIMA BEANS
Cook Lima beans in boiling water until tender. Mix together one-half teaspoon flour, one-half teaspoon salt, one tablespoon sugar, one-quarter teaspoon paprika, and one-quarter teaspoon celery salt. Add to two cups of hot beans and then mix in the tablespoon of finely-chopped onion and four slices of bacon cut in small pieces. Moisten with one cup of water. Place in a shallow, buttered casserole and bake until nicely browned.

After-harvest cultivation
Now is the time when weeds can be killed most cheaply and effectively.
It is easiest to kill perennials like witch grass and cow thistle now because their vigor has been somewhat exhausted by growing a crop. The hot sun and drying winds will work for you.
Thousands of weed seeds may be caused to sprout by light cultivation. This young plants will afterwards be killed. For this purpose a disk is effective—a gang plow or cultivator may be used.
Remember to manual labor. Use bar hoes and long implements if possible.
Change your soil of living weeds! Place after-harvest cultivation on the list of jobs that MUST be done. Do not leave it until you "get time." DO IT NOW!
