#### SUMMER FRUITS FOR WINTER USE

We cannot all own for costs for winter use, but we can supply the medium body heat through the medium of sugar, candy and sweetened food. #### DANGER SIGNALS

We have, from time to time, drawn the attention of our readers to the danger signals which, when they occur, should be taken as definite warnings and danger signals. Most of the diseases from which mankind suffers are not of the sudden, acute type; the majority of them are gradually developed over a considerable period of time. In most cases, the sufferer is not suspected until there are symptoms which send the sufferer to his doctor for examination. That symptoms which are danger signals which the patient should recognize. There were, however, before that, danger signals which the physician had been given the opportunity of examining the patient, would have been recognized by reason of his special training and skill.

The Periodic Health Examination, which means that regularly, once a year, the individual goes to his doctor for a complete examination, provides the most practical means of which we know to detect these early danger signals. Periodic Health Examination brings medical skill to act when it has the most to offer. Early treatment is the greatest advantage that curative medicine has to offer, because early treatment will mean, in most cases, cure, or at least no further damage. It is one relies on his own skill to decide as to the need for medical care, this may mean, in many cases, advanced disease with practically no hope of cure, and a life-long disability.

### Municipal Corporation of the Town of Georgetown

#### BY-LAW NO. 80A

WHEREAS it is provided by Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927, Chapter 248, 1-41 A park, or a system of parks, avenues, boulevards and drives, or a system of parks and drives, in any municipality, and the same, as well as existing parks and avenues, may be controlled and managed in the manner hereinafter provided.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subsection 1, a petition is presented to the council of any county or city signed by not less than five hundred electors of the county or city or township signed by not less than two hundred electors or to the council of any village, town or township, praying for the adoption of this Act, the council may pass a by-law in relation to the petition, with the assent of the electors qualified to vote at municipal elections, before the council of the municipality as provided by The Municipal Act.

(3) If the majority of the votes in favour of the by-law, it shall be finally passed by the council at its next regular meeting after the passing of the vote, or at soon thereafter as may be.

AND WHEREAS a petition signed by not less than two hundred electors praying for the adoption of the said Act has been presented to the council of the Town of Georgetown, and the council of the Town of Georgetown has passed a resolution in relation to the said petition to vote at municipal elections to be obtained before the final passing of the by-law as provided by the Municipal Act.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ENACTED by the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Georgetown that:

1. The Public Parks Act Revised Statutes of Ontario 1927, Chapter 248, 1-41 A park, or a system of parks, avenues, boulevards and drives, or a system of parks and drives, in any municipality, and the same, as well as existing parks and avenues, may be controlled and managed in the manner hereinafter provided.

2. Subject to the provisions of subsection 1, a petition is presented to the council of any county or city signed by not less than five hundred electors of the county or city or township signed by not less than two hundred electors or to the council of any village, town or township, praying for the adoption of this Act, the council may pass a by-law in relation to the petition, with the assent of the electors qualified to vote at municipal elections, before the council of the municipality as provided by The Municipal Act.

3. If the majority of the votes in favour of the by-law, it shall be finally passed by the council at its next regular meeting after the passing of the vote, or at soon thereafter as may be.

AND WHEREAS a petition signed by not less than two hundred electors praying for the adoption of the said Act has been presented to the council of the Town of Georgetown, and the council of the Town of Georgetown has passed a resolution in relation to the said petition to vote at municipal elections to be obtained before the final passing of the by-law as provided by the Municipal Act.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ENACTED by the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Georgetown that:

1. The Public Parks Act Revised Statutes of Ontario 1927, Chapter 248, 1-41 A park, or a system of parks, avenues, boulevards and drives, or a system of parks and drives, in any municipality, and the same, as well as existing parks and avenues, may be controlled and managed in the manner hereinafter provided.

2. Subject to the provisions of subsection 1, a petition is presented to the council of any county or city signed by not less than five hundred electors of the county or city or township signed by not less than two hundred electors or to the council of any village, town or township, praying for the adoption of this Act, the council may pass a by-law in relation to the petition, with the assent of the electors qualified to vote at municipal elections, before the council of the municipality as provided by The Municipal Act.

### Business Summary and Crop Report

The following business summary and crop report for the Province of Ontario was issued by the Bank of Montreal under date of August 22nd.

Retail trade is slightly above normal and wholesalers, with the exception of drygoods houses, report increased business as compared with last year. Collections are fair. Furniture factories generally are fully employed, with substantial orders for radio cabinets. Automobile plants and allied industries continue to operate on reduced time and compressed schedules. Knitting mills are busy, but woollen mills find business below normal. Packers report increased volume under year and domestic trade normal. Pulp and paper manufacturers are well employed. Steel mills and aluminum manufacturers are busy. An excellent crop of hay has been harvested in good condition. Fall wheat is expected to be well above the average crop. Oats and barley will be below average and the straw is short. Corn is an average crop. Cattle and hogs are doing well. Sugar beets have been greatly benefited by recent rains. The second crop of alfalfa is short. Also seed is reported of good quality.
