Ample time has elapsed for drovers, live stock commission men and packers to become familiar with the new standards for hog grading and the other requirements, it is claimed. In the interval, until Sept. 16 next, hog grading and the other requirements, it is claimed. In the interval, until Sept. 16 next, hog grading officials of the Dominion Live Stock Branch, located at stock yards and abattolys throughout the Dominion, have been instructed to file every assistance to all connected with the purchase and sale of hogs, in order that buyers and sellers allike may be in a position to comply fully with the regulations when the same become effective.

The new regulations provide for the classification of hogs into two classes namely, bacon hogs and non-bacon hogs. The bacon class is to be divided into two grades to be known as "select" and bacons." The standard for "select" hogs remains the same except that the minimum weight of 170 pounds W. O. C., or 180 pounds F. and W., has been raised ten pounds. Experience has shown that hogs of bacon conformation and type are sufficiently finished at the old minimum weight for this grade.


