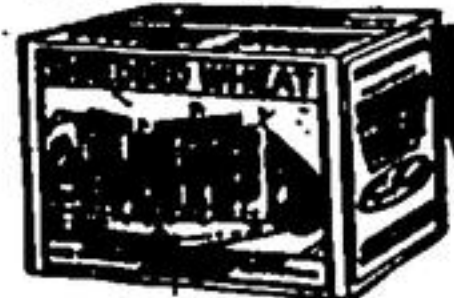

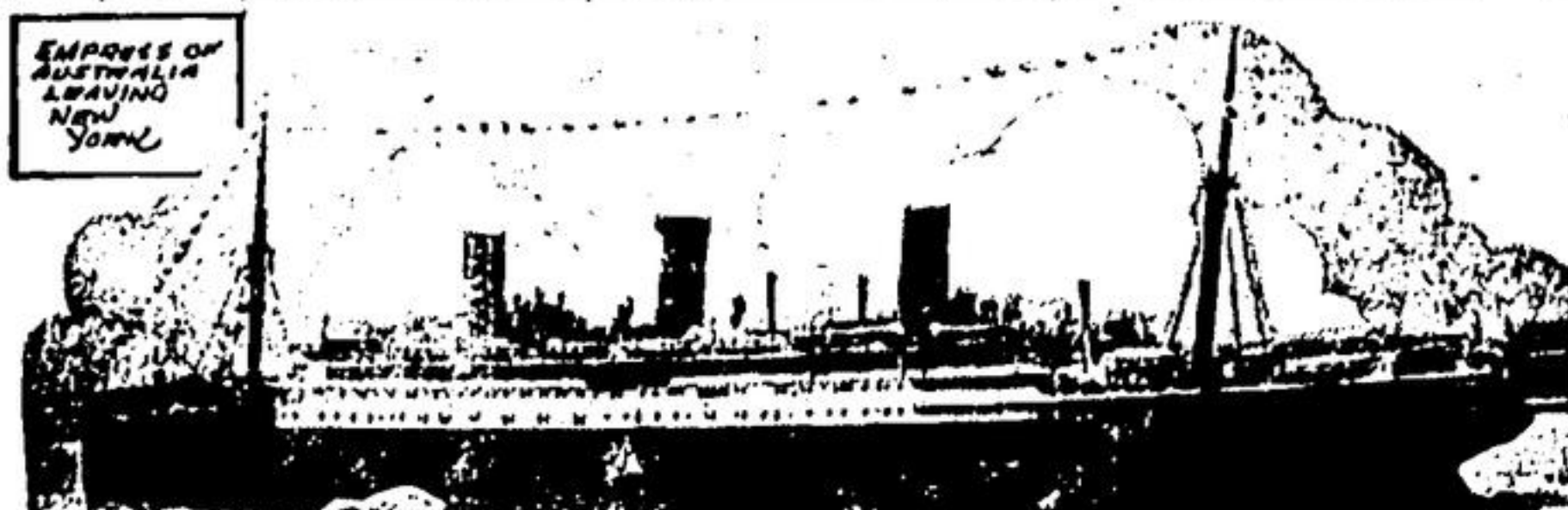

**"The World's Mine Oyster," Said Falstaff**



Why, then, the world's mine oyster which I with sword will open," said a famous character of Shakespeare, but the modern version relates to going around the world in a big and comfortable steamship with no sword to open the oyster. These are days of peace and world travelers now planning their tours will be interested to know that one globe-circling liner will call at ports hitherto omitted from her itinerary—ports rarely touched by visiting steamers. The "Empress of Australia," a 21,500 gross ton vessel, long a favorite with globe trotters, will sail from New York December 1, 1929, on the seventh annual Canadian Pacific World Cruise. Besides making her regular visits to the highlights of the Mediterranean, to India, Japan, China, Hawaii and other fascinating places, her itinerary this time has been extended to include Athens in Greece, Peking and Bangkok in Siam, with further calls at Keelung for Taioku, in Formosa. She will be gone 187 days, visiting 31 ports and places in 24 countries.

Athens is really three towns in one—the twisted lanes of the Turkish village before the Greek War of Independence, the broad straight streets of the modern capital and the interesting ruins clustering round the Acropolis which Paricles adorned the Acropolis about 500 B.C.

Bangkok, the capital of Siam, was originally built on floating pontoons or piles on the river's edge, but nowadays well-planned roads and streets radiate from the city in all directions, beautiful Buddhist temples are scattered all over the town, and the Royal Palace is one of the show places of Bangkok.

Keelung, the chief port of the island of Formosa, is a hive of industry. Formosa is half the size of Ireland and is governed by the Japanese, still largely unexplored, however, has all but wiped out these barbarous people. The seat of government at Formosa is Taioku. Here tests of Japankese, manned by coolies, transport the visitors around the town, one of the chief attractions of which is the Governor-General's garden, where the world's most beautiful tropical plants bloom in exotic profusion.

**Climbs Mountain Named After Him**



Rt. Hon. L. C. M. S. Amery, secretary for the Dominions in the late Baldwin Administration, who arrived in Canada recently on the "Empress of Australia," has as his objective in this country the climbing of the 11,000-foot Mount Amery, named after him in the Canadian Rockies. There is no official record of this mountain having been climbed before.

This attempt which was undertaken with the famous Swiss guide Edward Peus, Colonel Amery once took the 2,500-mile trip across Canada to Lake Louise when in company of Peus and A. D. Wheeler, honorary president of the Alpine Club of Canada. He set out for the peak located near the Great Columbia Rockies near the junction of the Alexandra and Saskatchewan Rivers.
