WILL TIGHTEN UP LIQUOR CONTROL ACT... The first step towards carrying out the promise made by the Prime Minister that the administration of the Liquor Control Act would be strengthened, was taken on Friday last.

At a meeting of Oakville council, a deputation of four men, under the leadership of Mayor Thomas Blacklock, was appointed to go to Ottawa with a view of having the east pier in Oakville Harbour rebuilt.

James Hunter, of Orangeville, on Tuesday, October 15th, celebrated his 100th birthday. The town council presented him with a comfortable arm chair and a suitable address.

Nov. Scotia recently voted to forsake prohibition. By a majority of 28,000 it carried a plebiscite favoring government control of liquor.
