To attain these two desirable aims, it is necessary that early diagnosis be made. This fact has been recognized, and scattered across Canada, are centres where examinations are made and the disease detected in its early stages. This is desirable not only for the case, but for the public; because it means control of the spread of the disease and public protection. These diagnostic clinics are maintained by some Provincial Governments and by the tuber-culosis zanatoria. Like everything else of that type, the clinics cost money to equip and maintain. A seasonable opportunity to assist the sanatoria in this work is provided through the Christmas Beal sale, which is commended to our readers.


