Rev. Dr. O'Meara Dead

WAS BORN IN GEORGETOWN—HIS FATHER WAS THE SECOND RECTOR OF ST. GEORGE'S CHURCH

Rev. Thomas Robert O'Meara, D. D., L.L.D., Principal of Wycliffe College, Toronto, and a leader in the Anglican community, died suddenly shortly before 4 o'clock last Friday afternoon, at his residence, Toronto.

While Principal O'Meara had not been in bed for about six months, the end came rather unexpectedly following an attack of heart trouble. He was 62 years of age.

About ten days ago he returned from Florida after seven weeks' stay. In September last he arrived in Toronto to start a tour of the world, visiting the mission stations where Wycliffe graduates are stationed. On the long journey he seemed to overtax his strength and by the time he reached China he was unable to carry out his original plan.

Dr. O'Meara was on a world tour with great anticipation of meeting the graduates and returning to Canada with an experience that would, he felt, be of great value to the cause of missionary effort and the work of the Church of England in general. It was with keen disappointment that he returned to Toronto in poor health and unable to continue his duties.

Principal O'Meara was born in Georgetown, Ont., on Oct. 16, 1864, his father being the second rector of St. George's Church. A Canadian, he inherited from his father the best academic and ecclesiastical traditions of the Old Country. Those who knew the father remember him as a man of warm and attractive personality, of high scholarship, and of very deep devotion to work.

Principal O'Meara received from him his earliest and most lasting impressions of Protestant and Reformation principles.

The early Canadian experience of the parents was marked by many points of interest. Dr. O'Meara's boyhood days were spent in "Fort Hope," where the family moved from Georgetown. In spite of a serious handicap, he was successful in obtaining various prizes throughout the regular course at Wycliffe. Ordination was obtained in 1887. His first appointment was as curate to the present Bishop Toronto at St. Philip's Church, Toronto. The friendship there began grew steadily to the obvious advantage of the college. He remained only one year, being appointed Dean of Residence of Wycliffe College.

A year later he was called to be assistant to the rector of Trinity Church, King St. East. The major part of Dr. O'Meara's parochial ministry was spent at Trinity Church, nominally a curate, but actually in charge of the multifarious activities of a large and needy downtown congregation. It is noteworthy that the Sunday school, although connected with one of the poorest churches in Canada, actually gave more to missions at the time than any other Sunday school in the Canadian Church.

Dr. O'Meara was married in 1889 to Miss Boyd.

JOHN LYONS KILLED

Fell Down Hay Chute While Feeding Cattle

In a fall down a chute in the barn, while feeding his cattle, Mr. John Lyons, prominent Chinguacousy farmer, died shortly after from injuries received last Thursday night.

Mr. Lyons, who was his usual custom, left the house early in the evening to go to his adjoining farm at 7:30 on the fourth line west, Chinguacousy, where thirty head of cattle are housed in a large barn. When he did not return, his wife became alarmed at his continued absence and notified neighbors, who went to the barn. His horse was lost outside. After a short investigation in the barn his lifeless body was found but a short distance from the bottom of the hay chute. A physician was summoned and it was found that there was a fracture at the base of the skull, as well as other injuries. It is supposed that he stumbled into the chute while throwing a bale of hay and was precipitated into the chute, striking his head.

Mr. Lyons was a lifelong resident of Chinguacousy township. He was a successful farmer and well-known and highly esteemed in the district. He was fifty years of age and was a member of the Methodist Church, Brampton, and the late James Lyons, in politics he was a Conservative and in religion a member of "Cheltenham United Church. He is survived by his wife, who is Miss Ethel Henry previous to her marriage, his mother, three brothers, Thomas and W. A. Lyons, Cheltenham; and Dr. G. W. Lyons, Toronto; and seven sisters, Mrs. J. Lyons, Cheltenham; Mrs. G. Love, Snelgrove; Mrs. G. W. Gladstone, Guelph; Mrs. J. B. Cole, Markdale; Miss Elia Lyons, of the Christie St. Hospital, nursing staff, Toronto; and Mrs. Rev.
