The Late Archdeacon Davidson

The Rev. F. H. Wase and Mr. Joseph Beaumont attended the funeral of the late Venerable Archdeacon Davidson of Regina at Guelph on Saturday. The funeral which was conducted by Venerable Archdeacon Scovell, rector of St. George's Church, was largely attended. Rev. Canon Loucks of Holy Trinity Church, Toronto, represented the Lord Bishop of Toronto, Provost Cochrane of Trinity College. Although Archdeacon Davidson at the time of his death it was as Archdeacon of Hallowell and Wellington in the Diocese of Niagara that Archdeacon Davidson was best known. A figure of national reputation he was in great demand as a special preacher, a lecturer, and after dinner speaker. The Bishop of Niagara who gave the address referred to his close friendship with the Archdeacon for over thirty years and paid eloquent tribute to his many excellent qualities of mind and heart. Archdeacon Davidson was present on the laying of the corner stone of the church of St. Alban's, Glen Williams, September 29th, 1901 and also preached the opening sermon, June 24th, St. John Baptist Day, 1902. Rev. Mr. Wase acted with other clergymen as pall-bearers.
