News and Information for the Busy Farmer

A Large Apple Orchard
Norfolk Orchards Limited operate what is probably the largest acreage of apple orchard under one management in Ontario. They have 225 acres of bearing trees, including a solid block of 140 acres. These consist mostly of good varieties such as Stay Green, Greening, McIntosh, Scarlet Beauty, Duchess, Wealthy, etc. In this there is one block of 1000 Redtop crab trees. The manager of this big orchard is Harvey L. Johnson of Simcoe. The firm is sold by the Norfolk Fruit Growers' Association.

Situation Serious
Dr. J. P. Booth, head of the newly organized economic branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture in addressing the present meeting of the O.A.C. Alumni Association at Toronto, offered some suggestions for dealing with the present crisis. He did not try to minimize the seriousness of the economic situation but suggested that the best thing to do in September is to cut the production, diversify farming where this was not being done, and study the conditions and try to produce to suit, to develop co-operative marketing and pay more attention to quality and advertising.

The Royal Trip
The regulations governing the contest by which boys from all parts of Ontario will be guests of the Ontario Department of Agriculture at the Royal Winter Fair next fall indicate that the contest is open to farmers and farmers' sons who have not received their 21st birthday on November 1st, and to be eligible to take part in the competition they must submit some statement as to the cost of production of some farm crop or operation. The arrangements provide for the following accommodations while in Toronto: free of charge, Railway fare to and from the city; lodging accommodation for four nights; meals while in Toronto; an extensive and vitally interesting program; transportation while carrying out the program arranged.

Plant More Trees
There are thousands of acres of land on Ontario farms that are non-productive that might well be planted to forest trees. Any resident in Ontario may obtain each year free of charge up to 3500 trees for reforesting, an additional 500 trees can also be obtained for windbreaks. These trees are distributed in the spring only to those who apply to the Ontario Forestry Branch, Parliament Buildings, Toronto.

Out Cost of Production
With a gradual drop in the level of most farm produce prices in the past few years, the cost of production again becomes a vital factor in agricultural operations. One very high factor in reducing the costs of production, the very foundation of all agriculture, is manure. However, manure is usually when a man uses his own seed, as the bulk of Ontario farmers do, there is no selling and hence no government regulations and as a result very little attention is paid to grade. Only seed that has been cleaned up to meet certain standards and conformed with very strict regulations in regard to noxious weeds is allowed to be sold legally in Canada and yet, in spite of all attempts to protect him, the average farmer goes ahead and uses ungraded and very often uncleaned.

Orchard and Spray Service
The Ontario Department of Agriculture has extended the orchard and spray service to the Counties of Dundas, Prince Edward, Hastings, Grey, Northumberland, Durham, Peel, Halton, Wentworth, Lincoln, Brant, Middlesex, Welland, Norfolk, Lambton, Huron, Simcoe, South Oxford and Elgin. Agricultural representatives and spray supervisors of these counties meet with various specialists and officials who assist with this service at Vineland during the first week in April at a conference to discuss ways and means for improving the service throughout 1930. Professors Caesar and Howitt of O.A.C. are the directors in charge of this service in the province. All growers who really want to make their orchards pay and who are willing to follow the Ontario spray calendar and special directions given by the spray supervisors, can obtain this service free of charge if they apply before April 15.

Care of Ewes
To a large extent the success and profits of sheep raising depend upon the care given the ewes during the lambing season. A crop of well-nourished healthy lambs means success, but a poor crop invariably means a loss. Good succulent feed with a reasonable amount of grain should be fed the ewes both before and after lambing and especially while nursing. Stock lams in order to supply an abundance of milk and keep the youngsters coming along.

Seed Program Endorsed
Members of the agricultural advisory committee of Elgin county at their annual meeting early in April endorsed the carrying out of a seed grain survey as proposed by the agricultural representative, F. S. Thomas. The survey is to be made in an effort to improve the quality of the seed grain grown in the county and to increase production. Mr. Thomas proposes to work through rural schools and the senior pupils will be asked to cooperate by furnishing samples of the oats and barley being used as seed on their parents' farm this spring.

A Remarkable Crop
In 1929 James McKittrick of Orton in Wellington County harvested 511 bushels of marketable potatoes off two acres. The field in which this remarkable crop was grown was of a light loam. The potatoes which were of the Green Mountain variety, were planted on June 10, after a sweet clover pasture had been turned under in the fall along with about ten tons of barnyard manure per acre. The crop was sprayed for late blight every two weeks after the potatoes were up six or eight inches.

Cleaning of Seed General
The crop bulletin for the first week in April stresses the general turn of Ontario farmers toward the cleaning of seed. Inquiries in Duferin have been numerous for good seed of standard varieties. In Dundas the uncertainty of the milk market situation is having a very depressing effect on production. The average price received at a sale of Holsteins in Durham was set at 145. A shortage of grain is indicated in Frontenac, while a heavy demand is being made for good seed oats and barley. Exceptionally favorable reports from stock masters have been received from Grey, while an increased acreage in spring wheat is reported in Hastings. Shipments of western horses are meeting a slow sale in Huron, while in Lambton seed grain is more plentiful than was expected.

GENERAL NEWS

After 33 years' service on the Toronto Police Force, Sergeant Edward S. Griffith, formerly of Trafalgar Township, will retire on pension. Sgt. Griffith joined the force July 5, 1897, and received his promotion as sergeant on May 1, 1919.

On account of the enormous expenses of publishing a newspaper these days the Windsor Journal, one of the best and oldest weeklies in Canada, has been forced to cease publication, and Uttridge is now numbered among the many one-newspaper towns in the Dominion.

Since the Old Age Pension Act came into force in Ontario, 28,214 applications have been made and of that number 27,004 applications have been passed on by the board.
