## Hay and Pasture Crops

The largest area of land used for growing pasture and corn occurred during the period 1914-23 or during the years of the World War and five years immediately following. The greatest acreage of small grains and roots in Ontario was grown in the 10-year period 1894-1903; and of potatoes and hay in the period 1924-28. Although hay and pasture crops have increased in area during the recent years, there has been very little improvement in the quality of most of the crops grown for these purposes. Much improvement is still possible in the hay and pasture crops through the medium of selection and hybridization; the choice of the most valuable varieties to use in hay and pasture mixtures; the use of artificial fertilizers to increase the yield and improve the quality, and better management of these crops.
