#### FUMIGATION

Not so many years ago, it was generally believed that whatever disease that caused the communicable diseases was blown around in the air. For this reason, when such diseases occurred, a great deal of attention was given to the air of the rooms which were occupied by persons suffering from communicable diseases. Rooms were treated by burning sulphur, by evaporating, spraying, or other disinfectants.

The idea behind such procedure was the need to sterilize the air. We know now that malaria and yellow fever are not air-borne diseases. They are caused by the bite of certain types of mosquitoes which have previously fed on persons suffering from these diseases.

We also know that the germs causing the common communicable diseases die very quickly outside the human body. Their chance of future survival is fairly good if they are deposited in milk or other foods where they can remain moist. They do not include tuberculosis or smallpox in this statement for reasons, the discussion of which is not permitted by the space at our disposal.

We know that in the case of practically all the diseases, excluding those spread by water, mildew, or other means, the communicable diseases are spread from person to person directly and not through inanimate objects. The germs of disease are carried by the droplets expelled by coughing, sneezing, spitting and loud talking. The spread of infection is accounted for by the taking in of these droplets by a second person.

Communicable diseases cannot be controlled by fumigation, by the sterilization of the air and of inanimate things. It is controllable only by the return of the person to the proper method of control is to attempt to find the individuals who are the source of the germs. The cause must be found and removed. The cause is always a person, not some school book, blackboard or chalk.

During the course of a communicable disease, all persons in contact should be carefully collected and disinfected, because these fresh discharges contain the germs in large numbers and are dangerous. The patient is isolated to prevent others from coming in contact with his body discharges and secretions. If care is taken, there is no danger. It is the care during the course of the disease, by such common sense disinfection, that is important. When the patient recovers and the secretions of his body are free of germs there is no danger either in him or his surroundings, and there is certainly no value in fumigation.

### Farm Drainage

The drainage of lands is receiving increased attention in Ontario. The high acre returns from orchards and other cultivated cash crops has stimulated the interest. ### Here and There

From obscurity to world power in the record of Japan within the past fifty years, Dr. Kamekura Kamo, Tokyo University professor and chairman of the Japanese National Committee on world power congress, here in a town of Canada and the United States and a passenger aboard the Empress of Asia, he attributed the growth of his country to progress in engineering.

The British Bowling team which has played 16 matches in Los Angeles in the last two months, losing five and winning eleven of the games, sailed for England aboard the Duchess of York recently. They came out to win the Canadian Bowling Trophy, but the five games lost were in that event, and they must wait next year for another attempt.

Seventeen European races contributed money for the hand-draft work while inhabitants of Labrador, the Arctic Circle, the Maritimes, Pacific Coast, and the West Indies, were invited to the Great West Folk Dances, Folk Song Festival, and other events at Calgary, March 19-22. The Premier of the province, the Lieutenant-Governor and Dr. C. Coleman, vice-president Western Lines, and J. M. Gibbon, General Publicity Agent, representing the Canadian Pacific Railway, gave inspirational addresses in this effort to "broaden, stabilize and elevate Canada's national consciousness."

Recuperation of Europe from economic ill effects of the war and active and formidable competition in world's production is making it normal and fair to expect that Canada and the United States to develop the vast potential markets of the Orient," said Louis Geunther, publisher of the New York Financial World, who sailed from Vancouver recently aboard S.S. Empress of Asia for a tour of China and Japan.

Widespread interest aroused in the United States as well as Canada by the musical programmes broadcast by the Canadian Pacific Railway on Friday evening over its own transcontinental network have led to negotiations between the railway and the National Broadcasting Company of New York, under which Canadian Pacific will supply WJZ and associated stations with a series of Canadian programmes made in Canada by Canadian talent. Five million receiving sets owned in a population of sixty millions will be reached by this extension which commenced first week of April.

Dairying was a profitable industry in the three prairie provinces of Canada last year when its value totalled \$77,000,000. In eleven of the large exhibitions held throughout Canada during that year these three provinces were awarded eighty per cent of all first prizes in butter and 86 per cent of all prizes, over half of which went to Manitoba.

According to a recent compilation made by the Canadian Government Bureau of Statistics, the average value of the occupied farm lands of Canada as a whole, including both improved and unimproved land, as well as the dwelling houses, barns, stables and other farm buildings, is valued at \$37 per acre for the year 1929.

Speaking on Canada's stake in the Pacific before the Montreal Canadian Club recently, Hon. Newton W. Rowell, vice-chairman of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, took occasion to compliment Canadian Pacific Steamships on their work on that continent. "There are many lines of steamers plying from North America to the Orient and Australasia," he stated, "but the Canadian Pacific Steamships; there is no other freight and passenger service on the Pacific that to-day is equal to that of the Canadian Pacific Company. We owe a great deal to that institution in developing trade."

Visiting sportsmen coming to New Brunswick for hunting and fishing have almost doubled in the past five years, according to figures given out by Hon. O. H. Prince, Minister of Lands and Mines of the province.

Additional air mail service was inaugurated between Winnipeg, Calgary and Edmonton early in March by the Canadian Post Office Department, leaving only the Rocky Mountains and the Pacific Coast and from western Ontario to Winnipeg unopened by air mail. It is expected that at least a portion of this territory will be linked during the coming summer.

Preparations are being made for taking another decennial census in Canada in 1931. This census will give employment to 15,000 persons. It was first taken in 1871 and has been taken every ten years since then.

M. M. Robinson, chairman of the coming year's board of directors party, due to arrive at Saint John aboard S.S. Duchess of Bedford, April 8, is to improve the teaching of Canadian history in Great Britain," says Kenneth Lindsay, who is travelling ahead of the party. It will consist of 15 headmasters and they will visit nine Canadian universities from the Maritimes to British Columbia.

Accepting regular radio programmes made outside the United States for the first time, National Broadcasting Company of New York has come to an agreement with the Canadian Pacific Railway under which the latter will supply WJZ, and associated stations in the richest and most thickly populated sections of the United States, with programmes of Canadian Pacific "cheerful and good" music. These will be broadcast at 11:15 every night from 9:15 to 9:45, Eastern standard time, commencing April 8. A second series will be broadcast by the American company from its stations consisting of Royal York Hotel orchestra dance music every Wednesday midnight. East standard time, commencing April 9
