OLD CHURCHMAN PASSES

Rev. A. E. St. Dalmas Past Service in Early Day

One of the oldest Baptist ministers in Canada, with over half a century in the ministry, Rev. A. E. St. Dalmas, 79 Ellersbee Ave., Toronto, died on Saturday in his 80th year. Deceased had served in Petrolia and Georgetown Baptist churches, and on retiring came to Toronto. He was one of the few present at both the opening service of McMaster chapel 40 years ago and at the last service in May.

The late Mr. St. Dalmas is survived by his widow and one son, Dillworth, in England. A daughter, Frances, predeceased him by a year and a half. Private funeral services will be held this afternoon, and later a public service in Danforth Ave. Baptist church.

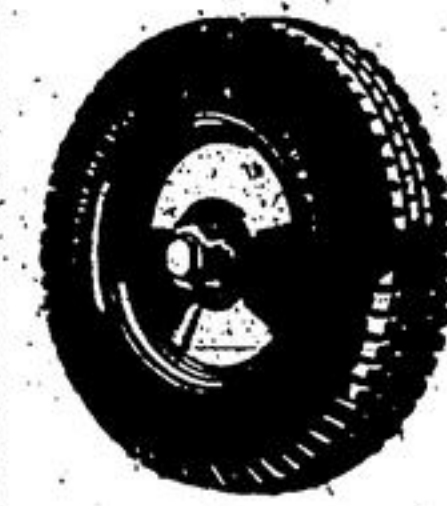

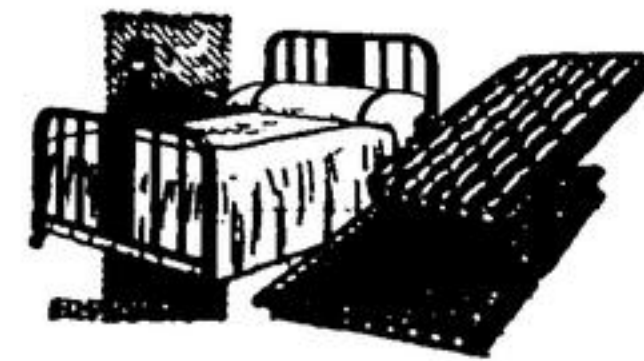
