So far as official records go, no hen has yet been able to lay an egg a day the year round, but No. 28854, as Mr. Whiting's hen is named, has within eight of a percent record when she laid 311 eggs in the 365 days in which she was a competitor in the B.C. egg-laying contest at the Experimental Farm of the Dominion Department of Agriculture at Agassiz, B.C.
