Halt County Judging Competition 1931

The combined Livestock and Domestic Science Judging Competitions held in Halt County on Saturday, June 9th were the largest and most enthusiastic ever held in the county.

For the first time the high boy and high girl in the two competitions are being given cheques for payment on their expenses on the overnight trip to Chicago with the party from the Province of Ontario.

In addition to the following public spirited gentlemen placed permanent trophies, endowed with miniature each year in competition as follows: Horace the late Donald Robertson, Milton; beef cattle, Duncan Campbell, Moffat; sheep, Thos. Blakelock, M.L.A., Oakville; and each of these presented their trophies in person or by proxy at the banquet which concluded the party must prepare for publication an article on "My Impressions of the Chicago Trip."

The Girl's Judging Competition was held in the school room of Knox Presbyterian Church, Milton, under the direction of Miss Betty Wallace, and assisted by Miss Edie Rowe, Grey.

THE HALTON COUNTY LIVE STOCK IMPROVEMENT ASSOC.

Last year a group of farmers came together at Georgetown to listen to an address by Dr. MacGillivray, President of the Ontario Veterinary College, about the burning question of contagious disease in cattle.

The necessary contact with the Livestock Branch of the Provincial Department of Agriculture was made, and already every farmer or group of farmers can obtain a subsidy from the Provincial Government when he wants to buy a pure bred steer, and as soon as his choice has been indicated by the officer of the association.

News and Information For the Busy Farmer

Look out for the cabbage maggot. The cut worm is best avoided by clearing your cabbage ground of lettuce plants with a tinned paper or mulch paper protection, sunk a few inches into the ground and standing an inch or two above it.

Three hundred students of Wentworth County recently visited and made a tour of inspection of the Ontario Agricultural College, as a result of which they obtained much worthwhile information.

Growers' Council Organized. Owing force to the recommendation made in the Somerset report, representative fruit and vegetable growers to the number of about 60 met last week in Hamilton and organized a Growers' Market Council.

Campaign Against Weeds. The provincial authorities are leaving no stone unturned in their campaign against weeds. Many of the highways have the usual prolific crops along the sides of the road.

FRUITING CROPS

Conditions throughout Ontario are very promising. From present indications it appears that having just started the season with the average year and the yield, especially new seedling, will be very heavy.

FALL WEEDS NEW

Where farmers are figuring on saving a field of clover or timothy for seed, the weeds in the field should be pulled out now while the ground is soft. The crop should be cut for hay or seed that it would be worth little in the fall.
