### SIR HENRY THORNTON RESIGNS

Sir Henry Thornton, Chairman and President of the Canadian National Railway, has placed his resignation in the hands of the Board of Directors of the system. It is understood that Sir Henry requested that his resignation be effective from August 1st, 1932. At the close of the meeting of the Board of Directors it was announced that Mr. S. J. Hunsford, Operating Vice-President of the Railway, had been appointed by the Board Acting President of the Company.

In connection with his resignation, Sir Henry issued the following statement: "I have had under consideration the railway situation which has arisen largely by reason of published criticism of the expenditures of the Canadian National Railway during my regime. I feel it is only fair to point out that all capital expenditures were made after careful consideration by myself and the chief officers of the company, and represented our view of what was necessary for the welfare of the enterprise. Those expenditures, however, controlled by the Government, I however feel that the successful operation of this enterprise can only be carried on if the country as a whole is heartily behind the management, and in view of this and the possibility of the Government wishing to consider the railway as a public utility in order to give them a free hand, I should submit my resignation.

"I am quite certain that the same devotion to duty and the high integrity which have characterized my management in office will be extended with equal vigour to the succeeding administration."

"I bid you all farewell: I wish to you happiness and prosperity with the hope that the future will bring to you from the use of my services such good fortune which fine service merits."

### BEWARE OF POISON IVY

Poison ivy is a climbing or trailing vine, with three leaflets and greenish flowers. The berries are white and even when dried, contain an oil which causes a severe inflammation and produces an intolerable itching. The poison is not removed by washing. People often confuse poison ivy with Virginia Creeper, the two vines often growing together. The latter, however, has leaves which lack the peculiar dark green shade of the poisonous plant. When poisoning localities where poison ivy may be found, either on pleasure or on work, it is advisable to make a search to detect its presence or otherwise. When the leaves are not difficult to avoid contact with it. If unfortunately one comes in contact with it, the best treatment is to wash the affected parts with soap and water.
