FOURTY-FIVE MILLION CROSS THE BOUNDARY

Over 45,000,000 persons crossed the 5,000 miles of international boundary between Canada and the United States last year.

The heaviest traffic was between Detroit, Michigan, and Windsor, Ontario, and Walkerville, Ontario, where two ferry companies operate across the Detroit river in addition to one bridge and a tunnel for pedestrians and automobiles. The railway and three systems of railway ferries also cross at this point. The traffic on the bridges across the Niagara river at Fort Erie, Ontario, Niagara Falls and Queenston, Ontario, was also heavy.

Total traffic international bridge, ferry and tunnel companies during 1931 consisted of 7,897,283 motor vehicles, 213 horse-drawn vehicles and 21,137,777 pedestrians and passengers, exclusive of drivers of vehicles. This tally counts one round trip as two trips that someone drives the total number of persons crossing the border on ferries, bridges and through tunnels was 32,726,740. Other international crossing, according to the Canadian Government Bureau of Statistics report on tourist traffic, included: motor cars, 8,374,474 persons; railway passengers exclusive of through passengers, 22,813,683 persons; Ontario, 1,705,740 persons who crossed from Canada to the United States and vice versa, by bridge, ferry and tunnel, makes a grand total of 43,123,210.

Would Cut Salaries to Curb Expenses

We take the following from the Milton Champion of Oct. 13th:

The only way I can see in which education costs can be reduced is by cutting the salaries of high school teachers. Reeve Dunton Campbell of Nassagaweya township, stated, in an interview, commenting on the efforts being made in Halton county and elsewhere to interest the ratepayers in holding meetings to discuss reduction of school costs.

"It is rather late now to discuss how to reduce costs when expensive schools have already been built. There are 12 municipalities that have to be run. Of course, when the debentures are issued, the cost of schools will automatically be reduced, but meanwhile it seems impossible to effect material savings.

"The trustees of the municipalities of public school teachers have already, together with the rest of employees of all kinds, been reduced 20 per cent. There is no no public school teacher here receiving \$1000. Some get \$900, some \$700, with the majority getting \$600. When we have a vacancy, we receive 15 or 200 applications. We could get teachers to work for \$300 a year in these times.

"In 1915, Halton county's share of high school expenses was \$15,000. Last year it was \$64,000, and this year it will be \$67,000. I attribute this enormous increase to the cost of building schools, and the salaries paid. In 1915, we do not recall exactly what the salaries were, but they were certainly nothing like what they are now.

"While no one is going to advocate keeping children from school, it seems that everyone nowadays is sending children to high school, especially since work is not so easy to obtain. Many of them will never need the education they get in after life, but once a person gets a high school education, he seems disinclined to do manual work. Yet there must always be a large proportion of the population who must make their living at this type of work.

"Following the cut in the public school teachers' salaries, we asked the high school boards to take a similar course, but very few have done anything of any importance about it. We have no control over them, of course, and only pay the money that we have appointed, but that is not a majority.

"The consolidation or amalgamation of schools will not result in saving. If a teacher is taken on at \$2000 and given a salary increase the next year, he will be taking \$2200. The trustees excuse this by saying they do not want to lose a good teacher, but all the same, a new teacher is taken on at the same salary. The county council met at Milton on Tuesday, when the most important discussion was on the desire of the government to go ahead with the construction of the middle road through Halton, as a third highway.

During the day the Roads committee met with Mr. Muir and other officials from the government, and at the Nassagaweya, asked for an expression of opinion from the council. The committee were convinced that the government were going to proceed with the work this winter. Halton county is liable under the act for 20 per cent of the cost of construction, and while his committee were opposed to building the road, they felt that, in view of the powers of the government, who could go ahead and build the road in face of Halton's objections, and charge the 20 per cent, that it would be wise to endeavor to bargain with the government to see a grant towards the cost of the work.
