### HIGHWAY TRAGEDY

'Twas only a truck-load of steers on the way To the butcher pen a hot summer day. Nobody cared if they were packed tight. They were just brute flesh—what mattered their plight? What did it matter if the road was rough and rocky? They jostled and rubbed till their hides, though tough, Were raw and sore with scraping the rails That pricked their hot haunches and pinched their tails. Their only protection from mosquito and fly! Ah, could they speak—could they utter a single cry? Tossing sand all day in the blistering sun, Jammed in a truck till the long journey's done, Tongues dry and aching for a long, From the pool in the meadow, with its grassy brink. Oh, if you seen this pitiful sight, The poor dumb things packed in so tight, Their bleeding, hopeless helplessness. Their need for a human's kindness! You'd never forget that jostling load Of crowded cattle on that dusty road.

United Kingdom so as not to permit such excessive quantities of bacon being sent forward to that market as to result in very low prices.

The bulk of Canadian bacon produced by export quality has, in the past, come from Ontario; therefore the stabilization of the British market under the plan announced by the British Government is of the greatest interest to the bacon producers of Ontario.

The county that produces the quality of bacon which sells at the highest price and at the lowest cost of production, will win under any conditions.

Ontario farmers should win, and to win we must pay close attention to every detail of production. We must improve the quality of the hogs, feed them intelligently, prevent parasites and disease. The hogs must arrive at the packing plant without having been handled and must be transported as cheaply as possible. The packers must then in the process of manufacture, maintain and develop the good qualities of the bacon, process it intelligently so as to realize the best possible price for the bacon.

In the past we have all made mistakes by not working unitedly together to the one common end, and I urge all to take a full share of the world's great bacon market.

The English of "John and Mary and Tommy" is clear and straightforward, the vocabulary is wide, and the choice of words is just and useful.

This is another feature of the patriotic and imperial work Lady McLaren Brown is continually engaged in towards the closer and kindlier relationships of Canada with the Motherland.
