## WHAT IS A TAX?

The Citizens' Research Bureau in a recent bulletin discusses taxation. It shows to us a very interesting question. What is a tax? It explains, saying, "A tax is a forced contribution towards the needs of a government. In early days the need of government had little or no relation to the needs of the citizen, and the contribution had little relation either to the ability of any particular citizen to pay for the service received from the government. It was in these days when the present tax complex of which many citizens are the victims was established. Many are still under the impression that taxation is a necessary evil. As a matter of fact, much exciting taxation and many existing taxes are necessary, and taxation in itself is no more an evil than the necessity of paying for any other service we use. A tax is, in fact, a contribution in kind, if not paid, force is exercised to secure payment. The force is exercised, however, by an authority over which the taxpayer exercises control in their capacity as electors. It is still a contribution to the needs of government.
