A new silver dollar, the last to bear the portrait of King George V, will be in circulation soon. Canada's last silver dollar was struck to celebrate the Jubilee of King Edward VII. The new coin is to be used to pay the general demand for silver dollars. Arrangements were made for its issuance some little time ago, and as King George V was to be in India, the mint had to wait until the king's return before the new dollar will bear his portrait. King Edward VII's portrait is the present King's head. John the Baptist came by Moses but we have nineteen centuries' experience of the grace and love of Christ. Admittedly great was John the Baptist, but he is less than half the kingdom of God.

TESTED RECIPES

Creamed Celery
One cup of celery cut in pieces is to be added to a small amount of butter, cut in shreds (be careful to remove all seeds) three tablespoons butter, three tablespoons flour, and one and one-half cups of milk.

Celery Chowder
One cup of celery, one small finely sliced onion, three large potatoes, sliced and one-half teaspoon salt. Cook together in two cups of water until tender. Then add two tablespoons of bacon or ham fat, add two tablespoons flour and pour the hot vegetable mixture over. Cook 5 minutes. Add one cup rich milk. Reheat and serve.

Celery Relish for Hams
1 cup chopped celery, 1 cup chopped white onion, 1 cup green pepper, 2 large green peppers, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 pint vinegar, 1 teaspoon mustard.

Cook the celery and onion and cook separately in salted water until they are tender. Then drain them and add the chopped green pepper. Add the other ingredients and cook until the vegetables are tender, and bottle.

Vegetable Chowder
Two stalks celery, 3 raw potatoes and one small onion sliced finely. 1 medium 1 cup canned tomatoes, 1 cup canned string beans. Put all in a saucepan. Simmer slowly until potatoes are tender. Season with salt and pepper. Add 1 cup cream or cream or cream. Serve very hot. This recipe is enough for six persons.

Celery Sauce for Hams
Six heads of celery, one cup sugar, 2 ounces mustard seed, one teaspoon paprika, 2 large green peppers, 2 large green onions, 2 large green tomatoes, 2 large green beans, 1 cup cream.

Mix 1 cup of celery with 1 cup of water, add 1 cup sugar, 2 ounces mustard seed, one teaspoon paprika, 2 large green beans, 1 cup cream.

Boil until tender. Drain and add 2 large green onions, 2 large green tomatoes, 2 large green beans, 1 cup cream.

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
