TESTED RECIPES

Organized Celery
 One and a half cups of celery cut in pieces 1 inch long, one small green pepper, one small red pepper, one small white pepper, three tablespoons of sugar, one-half cup of milk.

 Two small celery, 2 potatoes and one small onion diced finely, 1 cup canned corn, 3 cups canned tomatoes, 2 cups canned peas, 2 cups of water until tender. "Sweet Tooth" of Public Tempted by Farmers
 Canadian farmers have three means of satisfying the "sweet tooth" of their consuming public; honey production, maple sugar and syrup, and sugar.
