**Children's Aid Society**

Since the amalgamation of the Peel and Halton Children's Aid Societies into one Society and the consequent re-organization in conformity with the provisions of the Children's Protection Act, increased interest in the work of the Society has been evidenced on many sides. Additional financial responsibility is now placed upon the Society in handling homes and in preventive measures which will be increasingly emphasized with a view to keeping homes together by improving the unfavorable home conditions.

The new Board of Directors have already held several meetings and are taking active measures to perfect the organization of the Society by establishing local branches in all the centres of both counties. They need the hearty co-operation of all citizens who are interested in this vitally important field of social welfare. Membership in the Society is offered to all such on the payment of \$1.00 or upwards and it is hoped that there will be a generous response. The names of authorized agents for the Society will be published later, but may be obtained by applying to the secretary.
