SIXTY TAXES IN LOAF OF BREAD

In an article pointing out the excessive taxation in Canada the Financial Post states in part as follows: "Take, for instance, a loaf of bread. Few housewives realize that even within the staple of life is hidden a whole pyramid of taxes. There are over 60 taxes hidden in one loaf. Of this number ten are direct taxes paid by the bread companies. These are as follows: Municipal corporation tax, provincial corporation tax, provincial income tax, federal income tax, gasoline tax, motor license fees, excise tax on sugar and sales tax on shortening and printing. Manufacturers of the various ingredients of bread pay taxes and these are concealed in the price of flour, milk powder, sugar, salt and shortening also built and paid to the baking companies. The manufacturers of all of these seven products pay business, property corporation

and income taxes in addition to other miscellaneous levies.

Bread also contributes to the payment of taxes by the railways. Steamship companies and elevator concerns.

Taxes of the farmer who grows the wheat from which the flour is made must also be included in the total. He pays property taxes.

Actually, an estimate of 60 taxes in a loaf of bread is a very conservative one. This includes only major tax items. If all the ingredients—of a loaf of bread were to be traced to their source and indirect as well as direct taxes taken into consideration the total would be much greater. For instance one might include the sales tax on farm machinery and the various taxes paid by the manufacturer of this machinery. The farm machinery company buys steel from the steel manufacturer, who in turn purchases coal and iron ore from the mines. As a result we have a continual pyramid of taxes.
