Railway Fares to be Reduced

Substantial reduction in railway passenger fares in Canada will come' effective on June 1st, it was announced to-day by C. P. Riddell. chairman of the Canadian Passenger Association. Basic fares, for first class coach travel are being reduced approximately 13 per cent, branging them approximately to pre-war level. Day coach tickets at the new rates will also be good for passage in tourbt alcoping cars on payment of mgular berth fares for that class of accommodation. Round trip tickets will be good for six months instead of the present limit of 30 days. There will be a reduction in costs of standard parlour and alreplay car accom-

Speaking to a large gathering of farmers at the O.A.C. the Provincial Entomologist reminded his heavers listhop. that the corn borer last year came back with a vengance and increased on an average nearly three-fold: This molt warm weather last June and July-the oritical months for the inmuch greater in countles not under with the Act than those under it. The entomologist says there is little doubt that it will do so if we get nice moist growing weather again in June and July. And meteorologists teem to
