

SHEEP DOG TRIALS IN WALES

By Alleon Barr Brown Agricultural fairs are very much the same in Great Britain as in Canada save that in Wales the sheep, dog trials teem to take the place of the trotting races which one finds in most Canadian towns. Not having visited any Pairs in England or Scotland as yet, I cannot speak of them, 'In Ireland of course there the usual Shillalaght battle to provide interest and aminement, if we are to believe the many shows and poems on this pub-

There were of course the usual entries of heavy horses, cattle, sheep and swine. The cattle I noticed were all of the Shorthorn breed-such huge bulls, led in some cases by the quite young boys. The bulls are allowed their freedom

in the fields over here and so do not seem to become alarmingly ferocious. The little colts, too, seem to be extremely well-behaved and easily handled. The old country people appear to be great animal lovers. Humane Societies are of course very strict regarding cruelties. But I really think that most of the people are kind to their animals because they like to be rather than they are toroed to be so.

There were also show ring clauses and competitions among riding bornes and ponies, including musical chairs and ball and basket races. The chingren about here ride extremely well and their little ponies are usually groomed as sleek as satin.

About 3 p.m. the sheep dog treats commenced. There were many entries, so it was after five when wee last dog finished his trial. The ram came in fitful showers and the wind boisterously. But most of us ather in

The Welsh sheep dog is smaller than the Scotch dog, usually black in colour with white markings. Although their faces are pointed, and they are always keenly alert, they do not seem to be snappy. They are just eager always for their work. One has but to watch dogs that are on the waiting line to see that. It w like watching hockey fans at a same. In the trials so much time is allowed for the master and dog to round up the three or four sheep within the small pen. The master controls his dog by means of different whiteand it was very noticeable that where sympathy was strongest between manter and dog the dog tild his work best The theep-one from a different flock to make the task more difficult are released at the opposite side of the field. The master gives a short whistle, and off the dog goes like a streak around the sdge of the field to get behind his flock. He has to-be whitle commands put his show through two gates.

After he has his sheep through one put them through the other gate. After this, the dog creeps in closer, and with his Master's help he must put them through the runways twice. Then for the last effort he must pen thent. It all sounds so simple. But if some of my readers know anything about sheep they will know how contrury these animals can be. There were moments when we onlookers all held our breath. Then a great 'Ah' followed by cheers would mean that the little dog had his charges safely within the pen. Another dog takes the sheep off the field, and another trial is on with a new dor and other


expecially after it was all over. They had hardly realised what was happen-ing-just, some strange quiet force drove them cowards.

I could not attempt to describe how those wise little dogs twist and turn and wriggle about flat on their stomachs, to accomplish their difficult work. All to the commands of course of different whistles. Whistles may meen run wide (to bunch the sheep). 'Come in closer,' 4—Drop flat and remain motionless.' The crouching increases as the last pens are approached. It was difficult to take good photo-
