ANGUS H. DUNCAN

Georgetown lost one of her best citizens when Angus Duncan passed away last evening at Guelph General Hospital, following an accident on Monday morning. Deceased was a son of the late James and Mary Duncan, who had been born in Bradford. He was 47 years of age. In 1912 he was married to Miss Edna Kitchener, also of Bradford. He moved to Guelph in 1914 and has resided there ever since, having been employed as engineer at the Provincial Paper Mills. He is survived by his wife and two sons, Jack of the Bradford area, and George, of Guelph, and his brother, William, and his wife, Helen, at home. Also a brother, William of Salt Lake City, and three sisters, Mrs. James Patterson, Mrs. Jessie McLean, and Mrs. John Morrison, all of Detroit.
