## TERMINATING FEES.

## LESS THIS YEAR.

Thirty-five thousand bushels took the toll on harvest and threshing machines in rural Ontario up to Oct. 15th of the 1936 harvest season, Pro-  
fessor W. J. Scott, University of Guelph, says. About only the incomplete figures he has in this year's toll is believed to be well below last year's.

The threshing fee less than 1000 is \$177,000, and the year's losses to gleaning are estimated.

The fire marshal has devoted considerable study to the rural fires which occur while threshing operations are being carried on. Stock threshing was 90 per cent when twenty-two of this year's thirty-five fires broke out. Mr. Scott claims that the large increase in stock threshing has led to the increase in the number of bushels of threshing and smoking materials by ten times.

According to the reports, only three of the fires were caused by sparks from an engine or tractor. Most of the remainder started in or around the separator. How costly the threshing fees may prove will depend on the extent to which the buildings and their contents were totally destroyed in twenty-eight of the fires.
