CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAY EARNINGS

The monthly statement of Canadian National Railway earnings, issued here today, shows that the September operating revenues for the month of September amounted to \$17,500,000, an increase of \$2,200,000 over the corresponding month of 1935. Operating expenses were \$14,500,000, an increase of \$1,800,000 over September of last year. Net operating revenue amounted to \$3,000,000, exceeding that of 1935 by \$750,000.
