TESTED RECIPES
Apples
Now is the season when Canadian apples are at their best and most plentiful; therefore cheap. Consequently the recipes which are appropriate to the season:
Apple Sherbet
Wash, quarter, and cut into small pieces coarse-grained Canadian-grown apples in a pint of water and cook slowly until very soft. Rub through a strainer and add the juice of one orange and one lemon, 1 cup of sugar and 4 cups of water. Boil for five minutes. When cold, add cream or jelly. Preserved ginger cut in small pieces may be added, using 1 tablespoon for every 4 cups of pulp.
