NO HOLIDAYS FOR POSTAL PEOPLE

In order to encourage business the Postmaster-General, Hon. J. C. McLeod, has decided to operate the post office on every public holiday. Sunday, of course, excepted. It is expected this move will improve business in the post office department, already on the up grade. It is pointed out to support of the benefit to business in cities where there is only a forenoon delivery of mail by letter carriers on Saturdays, that as Christmas falls on Friday this year it would be the first of the week in large centres before letters and Christmas parcels would, in some instances, be delivered. The holiday service will mean extra postal help which will incur additional expense to the government which is to be compensated on subsidizing this increased mail service in the public interests.

INCREASING THE SALES TAX

Based on the recent speech of Hon. Charles Dunning, the public may expect an increase in the sales tax soon. Now eight per cent, it is rumored the new levy will call for ten per cent. Mr. Dunning admits the receipts for the past year are \$175 million below what was estimated, and that the money will have to be made up somehow. And all along we had been led to believe that under the new tariff with more imports and more exports, there would be more business and less taxes!

The increasing of the tax from six per cent, which was high enough goodness only knows, was condemned from the start, and if anybody wonders why prices do not come down, there is a reason. There is also a reason why they will likely go up when the new seven per cent tax becomes effective.
