WHY DOES ONE CITY PREFER LARGER TURNS TO ANOTHER?

Why does one city prefer a certain size of turnip while another prefers a larger one? Probably because a lot to do with it. In the United States, New York and Pittsburgh are famous for their large, four to six inch, in diameter, Boston like, turnips. In Canada, turnips from the preferred Ontario and Quebec are smaller, three to four inches in diameter. Canadian turnips are smaller than those from the United States because of their fine flavor and appearance, according to the Ontario Department of Agriculture. Canadian turnips are purchased by restaurants and by the average housewife, while the domestic turnip is sold for the most part to the stock raisers and to the factories. New York and Boston are the main consuming centres for Canadian turnips. The market for Ontario turnips is Chicago, Pittsburgh and other interior points, being more accessible.

HISTORICAL NAMES FOR COLOURS

Apparently we are to have official colours in connection with that approaching historical event, the coronation of His Majesty the King. There are to be Coronation Red, Coronation Blue, Coronation Green and Coronation Gold besides "St. James' Blue, Holyrod Green, Marlborough Blue and Buckingham Violet. There is no special mention of purple, so far as we have seen.

So from now until next year there will be a most careful marketing of colour dyes to bring out those shades, the names of which bear some historical significance nearly as much as the names of the King.

For example, Coronation Red, the official colour of the British Navy, has always been associated with rank and ceremony.

The making of colours is an ancient art—how old nobody knows. From the primary colours, red, blue and yellow, we have developed countless shades and tints but to obtain them we have departed from the earlier use of vegetable dyes, such as saffron for yellow or orange, and the use of insects, such as kermes and cochineal, for red and scarlet. We are now resorting to artificial or synthetic dyes. From carbon, iron, sulphur and acids, and a host of chemical reactions, we have become able to produce a vast array of dyes, even to the extent of having pink bread and green cream.

We import dyes to the extent of about four million dollars each year, and produce dyes in Canada valued at about two hundred thousand dollars. The dyes are used in a variety of ways. In textiles, alone, for instance, there were 28 million yards of material dyed, according to the latest figures.

IMMEDIATE HELP NEEDED IN WESTERN CANADA

MOTELATOR'S VISIT TO HALTON PRESBYTERY

The Halton Presbytery enjoyed its first visit by the new Moderator, the Right Rev. Peter Bryce, D.D., at its meeting at Oakville, December 1st. In his afternoon address, after pointing out the importance of the cultivation of civility and order, by waiting on God in prayer, to hear his voice, and gain strength for service, he related from his wide experience, in travelling from coast to coast across Canada, the finding of four trends in the life of the church, a closer co-operation between Protestant bodies, the deepening of the life of the spirit, spiritual advance, and the growing appreciation of the work of the church.

Over 200 sat down to a tastefully served banquet at 6:30, which was a beautiful fellowship was enjoyed.

The Human Element in Service, in the United Church in Canada, was the subject of the inspiring address by the Moderator which followed. Some who had intended going home to read a novel stayed to listen and became enthusiastic over the message. Interpreted with many humorous and interesting stories from life, he recounted many of the great achievements of the church; how it radiated happiness from ocean to ocean and challenged all to greater service. He spoke of a great faith and dauntless spirit of advancement which recognizes responsibility for untold millions, beyond the seas, the kind of William Wainwright, in a hospital in India whose hands were thought to be the hands of Jesus in the gentleness of touch in the operation, of the return of this patient, whose eyesight had been partially restored, six months later, having attached to himself a rope to which twenty-two blind men clung waiting to have their eyesight restored. He had told of his recovery and had led these blind men over the mountain himself, with hope that they too could be cured.

Dr. Wainwright has restored the eyesight of over 10,000 blind people. This is only one of the work of the church and the work of one of its many hospitals. Not only the Bureau for the Home Blind, but the worth of the sacrifice of a great people "The church—not it but they"—humanity makes its appeal to our imagination and consecrated effort. Love for Christ must continue to express itself in love for humanity. In closing, Dr. Bryce urged the whole church to be true to the Cross, and our brother man.
