WORKMENS COMPENSATION STATEMENT

During November there were 5,577 accidents reported to The Workmen's Compensation Board, as compared with 5,726 during October, and 5,713 during November a year ago. The total cases numbered 53. The benefits awarded amounted to \$178,118.77, of which \$394,357.28 was for compensation and \$137,760.89 for medical aid. The benefits awarded to date this year amount to \$1,826,223.23, as compared with \$1,847,203.91 during the same period last year, and the number of accidents reported this year to date are 55,938, as against 53,714 during the corresponding period of 1935.
