**L. V. COPE, POSTMASTER
OF OAKVILLE, IS DEAD**

Native of Oakville and postmaster in that town for more than 40 years, L. V. Cope died here Saturday afternoon at his home on Allan St. Two months ago he suffered a stroke, and early this week pneumonia set in. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Cope, Oakville, he was a Canadian most of his life there and was among the town's most respected citizens. A former president and secretary of the local lumber bowlers club, he took a keen interest in agriculture and many movements to better the town and district.

During his long connection with the post office influence was felt in the Dominion Postmasters' association, of which he was a past president.

Surviving are his wife and one sister, Miss Lois Cope of Toronto. Funeral services were held Tuesday morning from the home of St. Andrew's Roman Catholic church, of which he was a prominent member. Rev. Father G. W. Brothman sang the funeral mass.
