

cisoly what this phrase means. depth of definition, or the distance from nearest to farthest object from

the long that is sharply defined. Depth of field is controlled primarily in two ways. One is by the aperture in the disphragm of the shutter. Using a smaller aperture increases the range of definition. Depth of field also depends upon the distance for which the less is focused. The greater the distance. the greater the depth. When the long is set for 25 feet, for example, at some particular diaphrarm setting: the depth may be from 15 feet to 60 feet. Objects cluser than 16 foot will appear blurred, the blurring being more noticeable for objects closer to the camura. When the camera is focused for objects cluse to the camera, the depth la quite small. For example, when tocused for 6 feet, the depth might be

from 5 feet to 8 feet, again assuming a particular disphrages setting. Objects beyond will be blurred. Isn't there a way, you ask, to get good definition of both mear and far objects? Yes, if you want it. This is done by using a small aperture. and since less light comes through a untall aperture, giving a little longer

An experiment may be tasily per formed that will give a visitely demonstration of the need of proper focusing on the object that you want to be clearly defined. Remove the back of your camera and open the shutter after setting it for "time." Place the camera on a table pointing it out of a window fowards some fairly distant object such as a house or tree, Next, place a small piece of ground glass at the back of the camera. Now operate the diaphraym changing it from a large opening to a small one, while watching the image which will appear (unside down) on the ground glass. Note how the image changes in definition as the size of the open-
