BROTHER OF JOHN D. KELLY DIES IN CHARLOTTETOWN

From the Charlottetown Guardian, of March 4th, 1937. We take the following:

"Lieutenant Karl Kelly, 42, died in Charlottetown yesterday after the loss of his wife, Mrs. James Kelly and his son, the late James Kelly and Mrs. Kelly of Charlottetown and was born here in October, 1894.

As a young man he joined the militia with the Great War and took up enlisted for active service and went overseas with the 2nd Heavy Canadian Battery as Sergeant in 1916. After the war he served on the Canadian Army with the Field Artillery until the end of the war. After demobilization in 1919 Lt. Kelly again joined the militia and at the time of his death was a Lieutenant on the Reserve list.

A wife and four sons, Michael, James, Frank and Robert, and two daughters, Emily and Ethel, survive him.

At the time of his death he was serving with the Royal Canadian Air Force.

When in 1921 the Pending Summons of Canada was drawn up the wide demand for mineral supplements was unfortunate. Consequently no payment of compensation to the members of the council it was decided to grant a loan to the Salvation Army which had not been paid.

Major George Wilson made a strong appeal to the council to reconsider the decision.

Mr. A. E. Wilson, representing Lloyd's Insurance company, addressed the council with reference to the insurance under the Workmen's Compensation Act.

Mr. Ramsay asked council to defer their decision for a few days until the company could present their rates.

Mr. Victor Hall, acting chairman

of council considered the report of the committee of the whole.

County buildings committee recommended payment of compensation to the amount of \$414.17, and the insurance on the Gordon House be renewed subject to approval of Peel County council.

County roads committee recommended payment for tender for an exchange of trucks to ask for tender for a pick-up truck.

That we petition the highway committee to pay their statutory grant on our highway system, amounting to the sum of \$426,655.

Education committee recommended payment of accounts to Guelph, Waterloo and Rockwood communities.

We are requested to consider the county roads resolution from county council endorsed.
