graphed." Besentially true, but regardless of subject it can't be done unless the photographer can porceive some beauty in the "thing." The "thing" may be just a piece of rope, a cracker barrel or an old shoe, but in certain surroundings and portrayed under the effect of the right lighting, it may truly reveal beauty and make an artistic picture.

There is no rule of photography for discovering beauty nor any fixed criterion of what is artistic. Fundamentally, it's "every man for himself in those respects, but there are certain sound admonitions that must be obeyed if you wish to make a nicture that will be generally acclaimed as artistic, whices, of course, you prefor to join the fancy-free surrealist school of art and take your chances. Briefly, those admonitions are as

1. Provide every picture with a. single, dominant idea that will easily be comprehended by anyone to whom the picture is shown. The idea should be expressed by a principal object. Avoid divided interest at-


