GENERAL NEWS

More than \$10,000,000 will be spent in Canada immediately in carrying out contracts connected with the national defence program. Macfarland's half day holiday will be on Wednesday.

Barrie has 1,550 telephones, the greatest number in history. Through the generosity and genuine interest of a number of citizens there is to be established on the lake shore just west of Collingwood a summer home for crippled children. When an electric wire fell across a steel stanchion through which a valuable beaver had his head, in the large dairy barn on the outskirts of Walkerton, the animal was instantly killed. Placed on sale, at retail prices, in the United States, optimum commands a price of \$3,000 per pound.

Nearly \$2,000 in taxes have been paid by Hanover citizens already this year.

Wingham made a profit out of real estate. They purchased a vacant lot and operated it in the basement of the town hall with real estate and real estate providing the labor. Not only have they been able to supply their own needs, but they are selling it to neighboring municipalities.

Congratulations and a medal were awarded the King on Tuesday by Her David G. Aldrich, Mayor of Hanover, for an article he wrote time ago on the article in the Land Magazine of Liverpool, who forwarded it to the King.

Soviet Russia claims that its agriculture is now mechanized on the largest scale in the world, with 400,000 tractors and 8,000 combine harvesters added in 1937. It is planning to bring in the number of combines up to 118,000 and triple the number of cultivators. Midland Shipbuilding Co., a subsidiary of Canada Steamships, has been awarded the contract for scrapping four ships that have been tied up at the yards for some years and which were recently purchased by a firm of scrap metal. The company is also tendering on one of the new mine-sweepers to be built for the Canadian government. For the present, between 25 and 30 men will be employed.

CHANGING CONDITIONS

Conditions are rapidly changing in our daily life. Many can remember when oxen and the horse and buggy were in vogue. Oil lamps were in use. Along came gas and electricity, which changed things. Horse street cars were followed by electric cars. Automobiles later appeared, and today our highways are almost alive with cars from early morning until late at night. Years ago the prediction was made that we would be flying in the air, but many shook their heads and were doubtful. But the aeroplane is here, and who ever thought men and women would be making transatlantic flights to the Old Land. But it has been realized.

Canada is inaugurating a trans-Canada air service, and instead of it taking three days and four nights to make the trip to Vancouver, it will be accomplished in less than half the time.

But the latest invention is the auto-railer, which will be inaugurated on the Canadian National railways to meet the bus and truck competition. This vehicle is equipped with retractable pneumatic tires, wheels for highway operation and steel wheels for use on the other, without disturbing passengers. It is designed to provide an efficient, quick service between points that are close together, and to deliver passengers and goods at their ultimate destination by using the highway system and truck competition. But experts believe that the economy involved in its operation, and its adaptability, will make it a definite asset.

COMBAT WEEK SEEDS ON CANADIAN FARMS

The greatest difficulty in maintaining successful farming, and particularly in producing a more abundant supply of clean forage and grain seeds is the prevalence of weeds. New weeds are introduced on farms with imported commercial feeding stuffs which often contain vital weed seeds. These seeds are spread from district to district through the various transportation facilities, are disseminated within a locality in stable manure from towns and cities, and are distributed from farm to farm through threshing machines, and from field to field by farm implements. The wind carries weed seeds long distances; streams disperse them along their courses, and herbivorous animals, such as feeding birds help to swell the evil brood.

It is important to consider not only the large number of weeds now with improperly cleaned grain but also those already in farm soils. Some of the worst weeds in Canada are so prolific in the production of seeds that relatively clean fields may become badly contaminated, in two or three years if these weed seeds are allowed to go to seed. For example, a single plant of wild mustard, think shepherd's purse about 50,000 seeds, and tumbling mustard about 1,500,000. With such prolific weeds, it becomes quickly infested—with weed seeds, although the presence of the seeds is not fully realized at the moment, owing to their inconspicuousness. Only a careful examination will reveal their kinds and numbers, and with this object in view the Seed Bulletin of the Dominion Department of Agriculture gathered information on the prevalence of weed seeds in farm lands. Part of this work is to be found in bulletin 137: "Weeds and Weed Seeds," an 80-page illustrated publication which deals fully with the weeds in the Dominion. The bulletin may be obtained free on application from the Public Information and Extension Branch of the Department at Ottawa. Much information is also given on seed cleaning and seed cleaning arrangements.
