Highway Toll Lower If Drivers Go Slow. New Accident Prevention Signs to "Save Money and Save Lives". Do you want to save money over Civic Holiday week-end? Get more miles for your oil bills? Get more miles to the gallon of gas? Such questions are being removed from accident prevention programs, but in appealing to automobile operators through their pocketbooks, the Industrial Accident Prevention Association is pointing out in a special report just issued, that when you speed you speed down your life. Since lower speeds give greater control of the car and help avoid accidents. At high speeds, oil is consumed faster than at reasonable speeds; tire wear is greater; gasoline consumption is much greater; and there is a greater wear and tear on the car itself when running at unreasonably high speeds. The cost of operating a car, whereas the thinking motorist who drives at a reasonable rate of speed is not only saving his costs but obeying the law in his consideration of all who are travelling on the streets and highways. "This is something to think about," the report concludes, "drive at a reasonable speed and save money and save lives."
