Exhibitions Dates
Peterborough, Ont., Industrial Exhibition, August 18th to 21st.
Central Canada Exhibition, Ottawa, August 19th to 24th.

Canadian horses are in demand in view of the competition. Of the shipments to the British Isles the largest consisted of 70 fine horses for the London market where prices, varying from \$300 to slightly over \$500, were obtained. The horses which were being sold were clean-legged animals, each averaging over a ton in weight.

Gather Eggs Often
Eggs should be gathered at least twice daily. The more often the better during hot weather. The time of one gathering should be just before dark or near to it as practicable.

The last gathering may not produce a greater number of eggs, but everybody here will commonly search out the nest containing eggs after the day's laying has ceased, failure to gather later in the day is a common source of dissatisfaction.

Each gathering should be placed in the coolest part of the cellar if no other cool spot is available, as soon as gathered. Eggs should not be packed into cartons or cans immediately if this can be avoided. The ideal container for cooling eggs is a wire tray. A wire basket is the next best, and perhaps the most satisfactory way of packing them is ordinary paper containers for sale as waste paper containers.

Seed Cleaners at Ridgeway
Work is being rushed on the new seed cleaning plant at Ridgeway Experimental Farm to get it ready for fall wheat. The new one-storey structure is to be 60 feet by 30 feet, and will have a large laboratory and testing soil. There are many such cleaners and graders throughout the province. Others in the southwestern area are located at Dresden, Wyndham and Shubenacadie.

It will also have a small beet picker and complete dust-removing machine. Farmers will be charged a reasonable price for their seed cleaned and graded will be able to get their seed tested at the same time.

Chickens on Range
Chickens require less attention while on range than at any other time and, if a few simple precautions are taken, clean grass or clover ranges will provide ideal conditions for just-dug, well-grown vigorous stock with a minimum amount of labour and expense.

The Dominion Experimental Station, Peterborough, Ont., are engaged in work which the chickens are from 6 to 9 weeks of age. The brooder houses are moved to a clover field on which there were no chickens for at least a week, and the chickens are confined to a yard until they are between three and four months of age. They are then moved to a range on which there were no chickens previously. A temporary fence, which provides access only to chickens, is built around the feed hopper. Water is provided in troughs. This method of watering is preferable to allowing the birds to drink from springs or creeks, as these places provide conditions which are favourable for the spreading of parasites.

Sugar Beet Crop
