

PRE-COOL AND HANDLE POULTRY QUICKLY

The pre-cooling and proper handling of poultry killed on the farm or at a processing plant is particularly important because the birds can die quickly if the birds are not cooled without delay and also handled properly.

Poultry killed on the farm and sold direct through local markets, poultry pools where no pre-cooling facilities are available frequently lose their blood with the consequent depreciation in the market appearance of the birds and the failure to sell at best price on the market, according to the Chief Market Poultry Inspector, Dominion Department of Agriculture.

Most of the farm poultry is killed in the fall when cool temperatures prevail. If proper care is then observed in assembling and packing the birds in the best condition, the temperature of the pre-cooling room should be checked frequently with a reliable thermometer at a temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit. In the case of pre-cooling and handling dressed poultry, fresh poultry can be handled satisfactorily in temperatures of 40 degrees F. than in temperatures higher than 40 nor less than 32 degrees, unless the birds will freeze. Every effort should be made to pack the birds quickly and intended for cold storage they should be handled without delay. If they are intended for immediate consumption or for sale as fresh birds, they should be held in the best condition.

When pre-cooling poultry on the farm the birds should be cooled as closely as possible to a temperature of 32 degrees whether pre-cooled outside or in the cooler or any other part of the house. It is unsafe to cool at the temperature. It should be checked by a thermometer. When transferring the dressed poultry from the farm to the processing point, the same uniform temperature should apply. If the temperature is much higher or lower than that at which the birds were pre-cooled, most of the benefits of pre-cooling will be lost. Provision should therefore be made if the weather is at freezing point to keep the birds from freezing, an if warm to keep them cool.

Some of the chief essentials in handling dressed poultry are—

1. See that the highlights of the vocation, the reflections of the electric fan, threatening to blow the lights out, do not affect the electric fan.

2. Birds should be hung up by both feet and allowed to pre-cool for twenty-four hours. The temperature of the pre-cooling should be as close to 32 degrees as possible.

3. The temperatures should be checked frequently with a thermometer.

In transporting poultry to assemble or selling points it should be held at the same temperature at which it was pre-cooled.

4. Whether the assembling of poultry for packing purposes is being done at pool landing points, packing houses or country stores, the temperature of the room where the poultry is to be packed should be kept at a uniformly low temperature.

The birds when received should be hung up or spread out and they should never be put in piles or thrown about.

In any case, the picture serves to show that any capable amateur photographer can do a good job of handling dressed poultry without apologies. All you need to do is to pick up a number of incongruous objects about the house, place them in juxtaposition on a table top, spot-light the scene with a couple of photographic flood-light bulbs, take the pictures and you're in business. What's that? But if you challenge it as not being Surrealism, you can call it Dadaism, or what have you in artistic cults, and get still more fun out of the argument.

Invention of Coinage

Authorities on the subject tell us that it is to Lydia that we owe the invention of coinage. In all times and in all countries the privilege of coinage has been allowed the sovereign.

Croesus of Lydia was the first monarch to introduce a bimetallic system of coinage—gold and silver—in proportion of about three to four.

This was some time between 500 and 500 B.C. Metal was chosen, doubtless by reason of its durability, and in the case of gold and silver, by reason of their intrinsic value. Silver and bronze first came into use in Lydia, from which date sufficient gold was overcomes. The loss liable a metal is to change in value, the better it is suited for a standard.
