"INFANTILE PARALYSIS" (POLIOMYELITIS)

The Department of Health has a sufficient supply of Convalescent Serum for present demands.

In anticipation of further requirements the Department now requests that persons who are willing to provide blood for this purpose (donors) register with the medical officer of health in their district.

The Department remunerates donors on the basis of Ten Dollars for 100 cubic centimeters; the usual amount withdrawn from one donor is 200 cubic centimeters.

Children under fourteen years of age are not eligible. Persons who have suffered an attack of the disease during the present year are also not eligible.

Those who have already acted as donors need not register again.

When a clinic is to be held, donors will be notified through their medical officer of health.

HYDRO INFORMATION

Ontario Hydro users have saved precisely \$4,965,737 through rate reductions in urban and rural districts.

Georgetown consumers will save \$2025 as a result of action by the Commission in the current year of 1937.

Three factors have made possible the rate reductions throughout the Hydro System—better business conditions, administrative economies and revision of the power during 1936 on the Niagara system.

Hydro statisticians calculate that if Ontario Hydro users had to pay for power at the same rates as prevail in commercially operated United States systems about \$40,000,000 would be added to their bills.

While Hydro consumers, of course, never have afforded to have purchased at old private power rates the quantities of electricity they have consumed, the difference between Hydro bills down through the Hydro years and the cost of that same amount of power bought at pre-Hydro rates now totals roughly \$1,500,000,000.

The Department of Education is prepared to issue every certificate from the kindergarten to the university without any special written examination on the part of the pupil.

Dr. Duncanson, Deputy Minister of Education, told the teachers who have been taking the summer courses in education at the Toronto Normal School, at a dinner recently.

But, added Mr. McArthur, the department could not proceed to take action beyond public opinion. The greatest stumbling block to the removal of external examinations was the parents, he pointed out.

TESTED RECIPES

The following recipes are taken from the bulletin published by the Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa. "Cheese for Better Meals" by Laura C. Pepper, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch. The bulletin may be obtained on request free of charge from the Publicity and Extension Branch.

Cheese Soup: 4 cups milk, 2 or 3 slices onion, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon paprika, 1/2 cup grated cheese, Yolks of 3 eggs.

Cheese Fudge: 4 slices butter bread 1/2-inch thick, 1 cup grated cheese, 3 eggs, 1/2 teaspoon mustard, 2 cups milk, Salt.

Cheese Pudding: 1 1/2 cups milk, 3 tablespoons butter, 4 tablespoons flour, 1 cup milk, 1/2 teaspoon salt, Yolks of 3 eggs, Few grains cayenne, 1/2 cup cheese, grated.

Cheese Souffle: 3 tablespoons butter, 4 tablespoons flour, 1 cup milk, 1/2 teaspoon salt, Yolks of 3 eggs, Few grains cayenne, 1/2 cup cheese, grated.

Cheese Sticks: 1 1/2 cups milk, 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs, 1 egg, 1/2 cups cooked macaroni, 1 cup cheese, sliced, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 1 tablespoon chopped pimiento, 1/2 teaspoon minced onion, 1/2 cup melted butter, Salt and pepper.
