HEALTH

The Quebec City diphtheria epidemic emphasizes the danger of neglecting toxoid precautions. In the opinion of the Health League of Canada, which has sponsored anti-diphtheria campaigns in all parts of the Dominion.

At the head office of the League it is pointed out that Quebec City is the only large city in Canada not able to show an improvement in the diphtheria incidence and death rates for the past ten years. All the other cities adopted a toxoid program some years ago and a survey made by the Health League reveals the progress made.

With the exception of Quebec City, the cities of over 50,000 population reported 37 deaths ten years ago and last year only 34 out of 258 for all Canada. Quebec City had 21 deaths in 1927 and 25 in 1936.

Hamilton was the pioneer in the control of diphtheria, first with a combination of toxin and anti-toxin administered to well children as a preventive and finally with the improved toxoid. That City has not had a diphtheria death in the six years ending 1936 and only four cases in that time.

Toronto had only two deaths in 1936 and none in 1934, the only city of its size in America to show such a record. So far this year there has not been a single death here.

In the smaller cities where prevention of diphtheria has been seriously undertaken, the disease has been practically wiped out. Westmount, Quebec and New Toronto have not had a death for ten years, Welland and Fort William for nine years, Woodstock and St. Catharines for eight years, Brantford and Fredericton for seven years. At least fifteen other cities in Canada, including the large cities of Ottawa, Windsor and Calgary had no deaths from diphtheria in 1936.
