The enrolment at the Milton Three Month Short Courses in Agriculture and Home Economics has now increased to sixty-nine and with quite a number of others planning to enroll in the near future excellent attendance seems assured. Aside from the regular classroom work in live stock and farm mechanics the members of the agricultural class have during the past two weeks paid visits to such outstanding live stock farms as Lindsay Bpss., Trafalgar township; H. H. Bull & Son, Brampton; J. M. Fraser, Streetsville, and J. L. Neelands & Sons, Hornby. Special lectures to date include T. C. Adams of the Dairy Branch, who covered cream grading and other special dairy problems, and I. C. Marritt of the Forestry Dept., whose special subject is reforestation.

At the Oddfellows Hall where the class in Home Economics is being held, the young ladies are taking special work in clothing under Miss L. G. Howell, and foods and nutrition under the direction of Miss Lilly Petty. The weekly Literary Society on Friday afternoon, in addition to musical selections by Miss Evelyn Sherin and Mr. Richard Waller and the weekly class paper which was read by Miss Charlotte Wilson, included a most interesting address on "Laws of Interest to Rural People," by Geo. Elliott, well known barrister of Milton.

We understand from J. E. White-lock, Halton Agricultural Representative who is in charge of the courses, that the members of both classes will during the next week pay a visit to the Ontario Agricultural College and Macdonald Institute, Guelph, where

an interesting day's programme is being arranged.
