Even in war time Christians try to be at peace on Christmas Day. There will be a strange irony in singing songs of peace throughout the Christmas season of 1937, remembering what has happened in Spain and in China durig the past year. Yet we must no: be discouraged. It may take many years to eradicate the deeply-rooted habit of war from international life. We are more convinced than ever! that the Christian ideal of peace is right. The slaughter of non-combatants, the cowardice of dropping bombs from the air and the ruthlessness of military aggressors makes war a hideous and hateful thing. Christ sought to teach brotherhood, and war is a denial of brotherhood. With so much want and disease present upon the earth, humanity needs
