#### CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS

The following from the Canadian Underwriters' Association is a timely warning regarding fire hazards: Following our usual custom at this season of the year, I beg to draw your attention to the potential danger to life and property from Christcountry stations of the Canadian Namas decorations, such as combustible draperies, acenery, cotton to represent snow, etc. Displays of this nature, and the lighting arrangements in connection therewith, add very considerably to the ordinary risks of fire.

I would also point out that should an accident involving fire occur in a crowded store or meeting, the rapid apread of flame in such flammable material is almost certain to occasion a panic with attendent risks to life. A few simple precautions may reduce the danger to a minimum, and these. should be considered essential where large numbers of people, particularly children are gathered.

See that flammable material is clear of and not hung over heating and lighting devices, steam pipes, stovepipes, electric light bulbs, etc. See that your electric circuits are properly fused and not overloaded by the addition of temporary lights. An examination of your electrical installation by an Inspector of the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario is recommended.

Examine your fire extinguishing appliances and see that they are sufficent, in good order, and readily accossible.

See that all exits are plainly marked and not obstructed. Have all temporary decorations removed and safely disposed of as soon as they have served their purpose. Remember that nothing can render these displays absolutely safe, and that if accidents are not to mar the
