Seed Grain Suggestions for Spring

The Ontario Department of Agrigrain cleaned and set, aside for his seed. Many farmers appear to think that because their grain this year is off colour and a little under standard in weight that it will not make mitable seed, but tests already made show that when this off-coloured and under-weight grain has been thoroughly cleaned up to a 50% cut in some instances, good seed was secured which germinated as high as 90%. 
